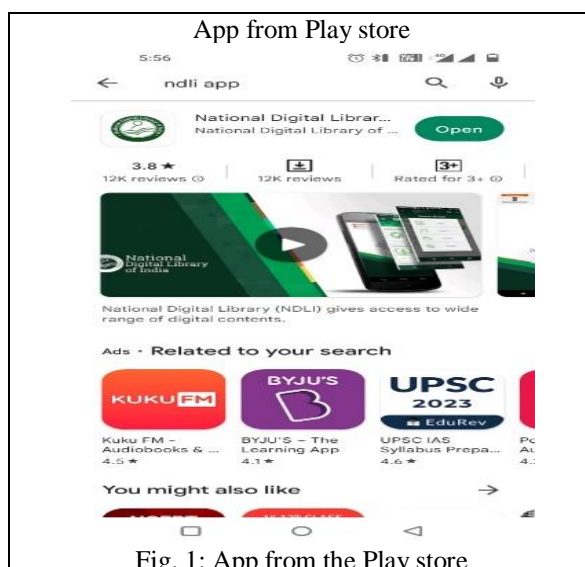


Fig. 1: App from the Play store

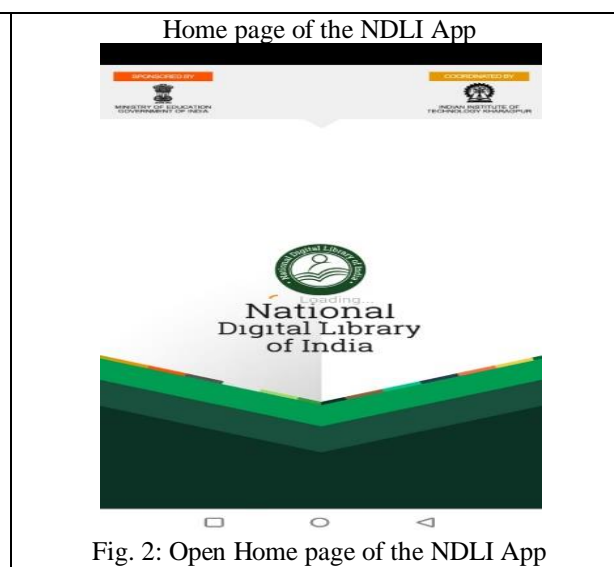


Fig. 2: Open Home page of the NDLI App

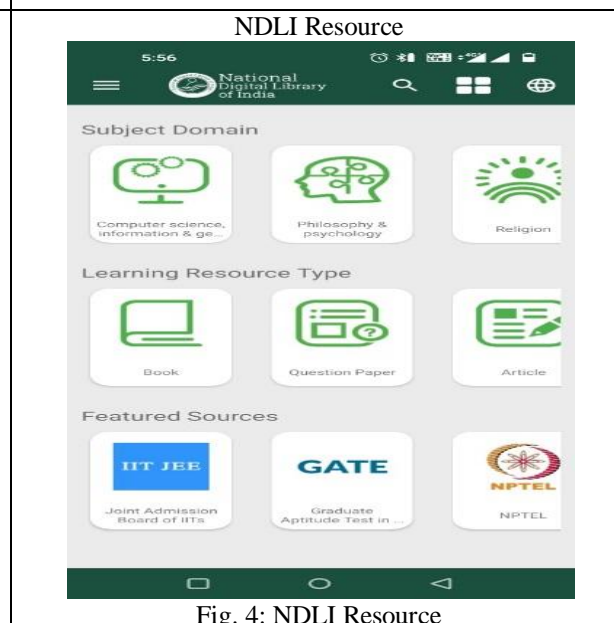


Fig. 4: NDLI Resource

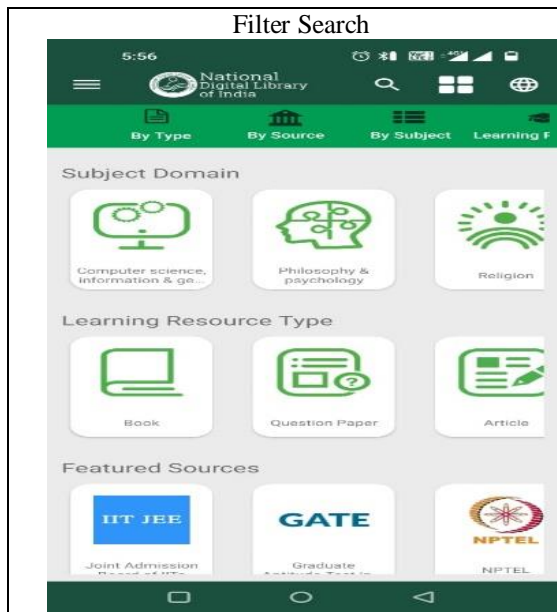


Fig. 5: Filter search

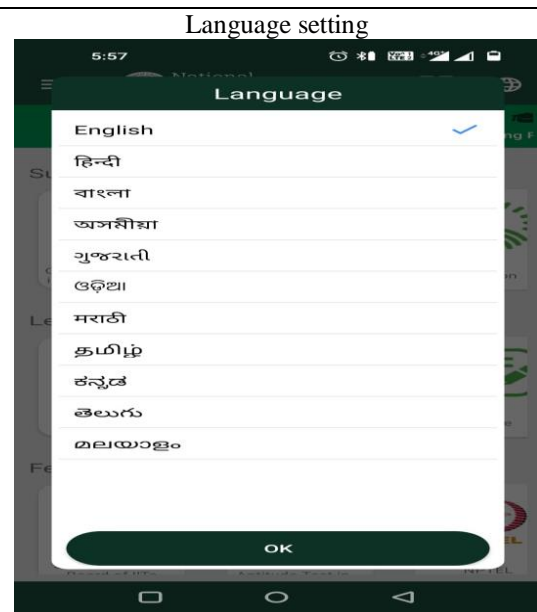


Fig. 6: Language setting

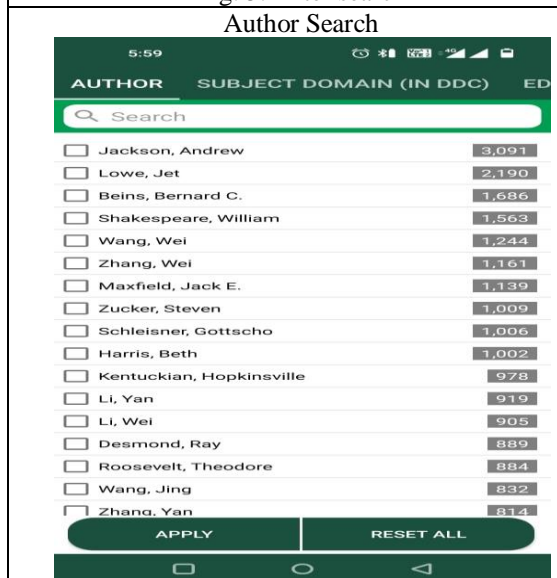


Fig. 7: Author Search

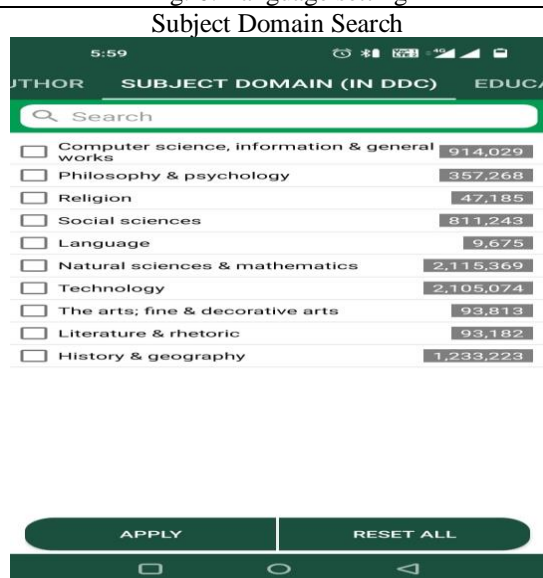


Fig. 8: Subject Domain Search

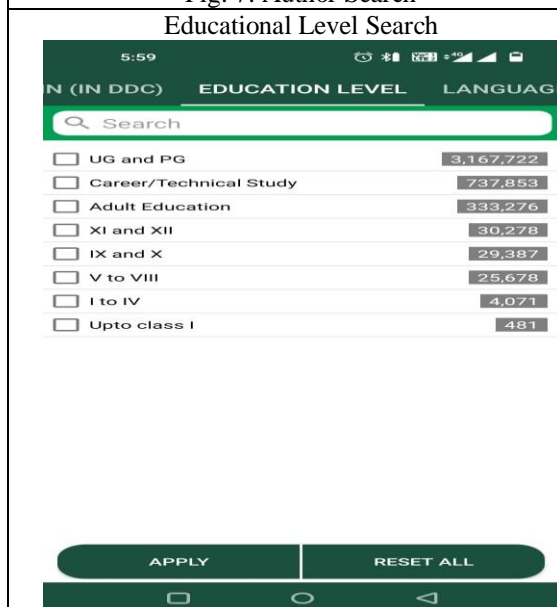


Fig. 9: Educational Level Search

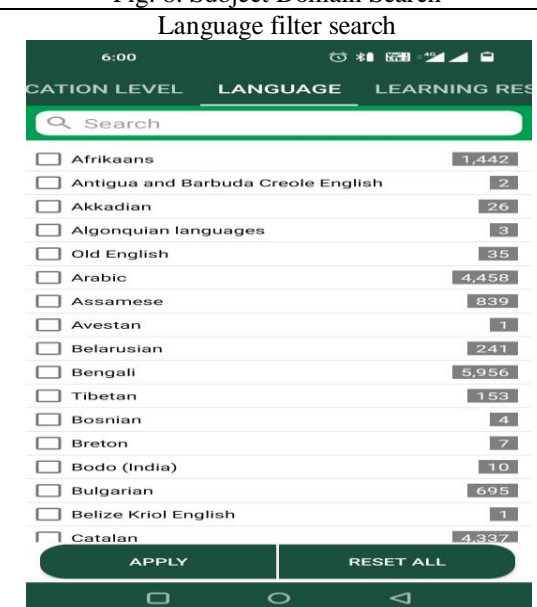


Fig. 10: Language filter search

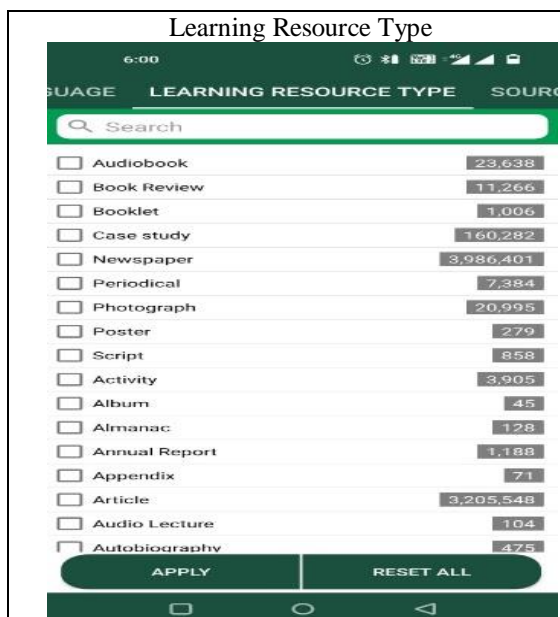


Fig. 11: Learning Resource Type

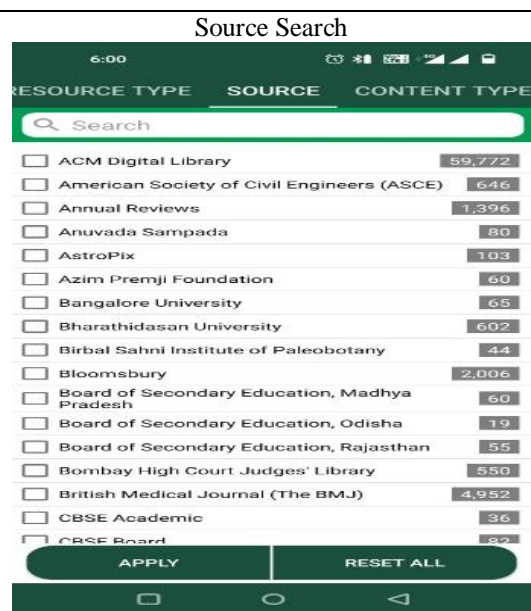


Fig. 12: Source Search

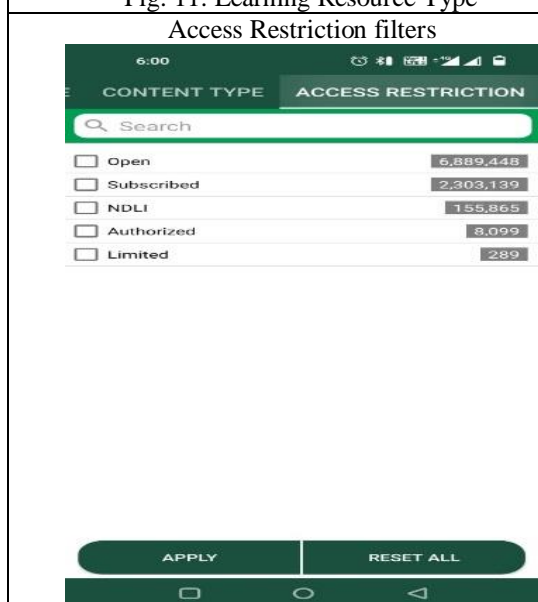


Fig. 13: Access Restriction filters

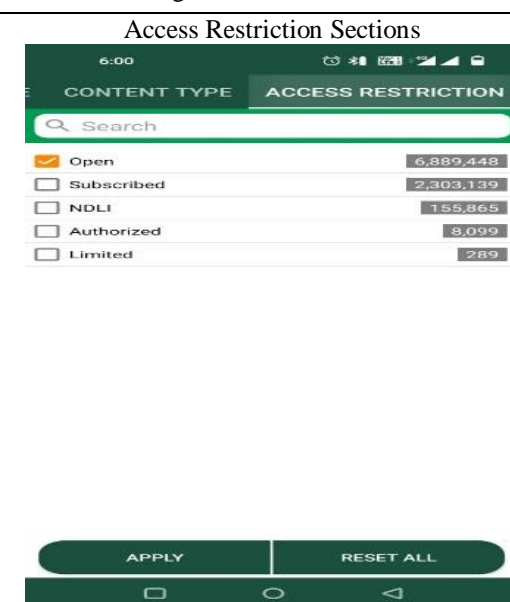


Fig. 14: Access Restriction Sections

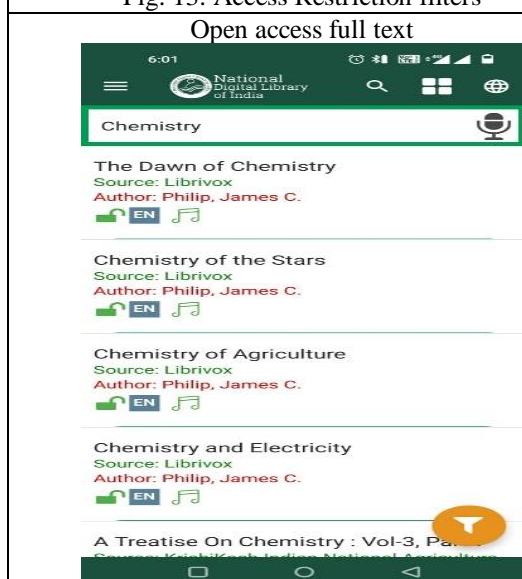


Fig. 15: Open access full text

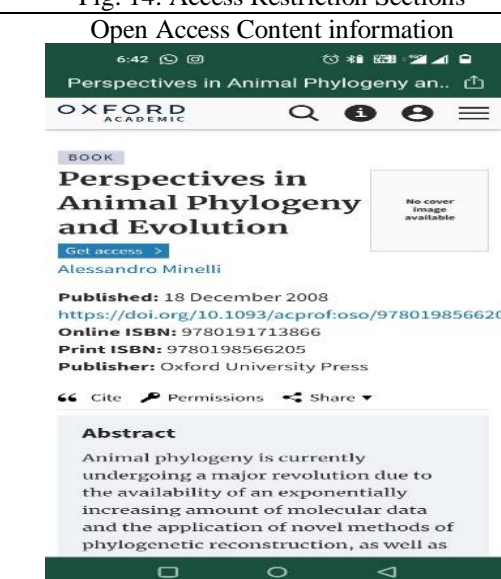


Fig. 16: Open Access Content information

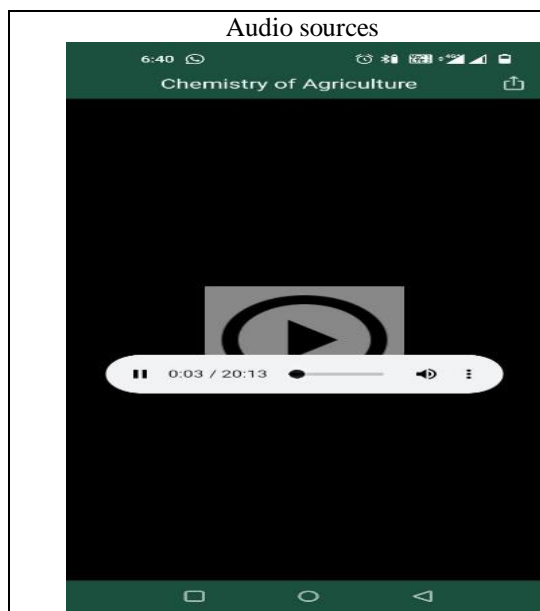


Fig. 17: Audio sources

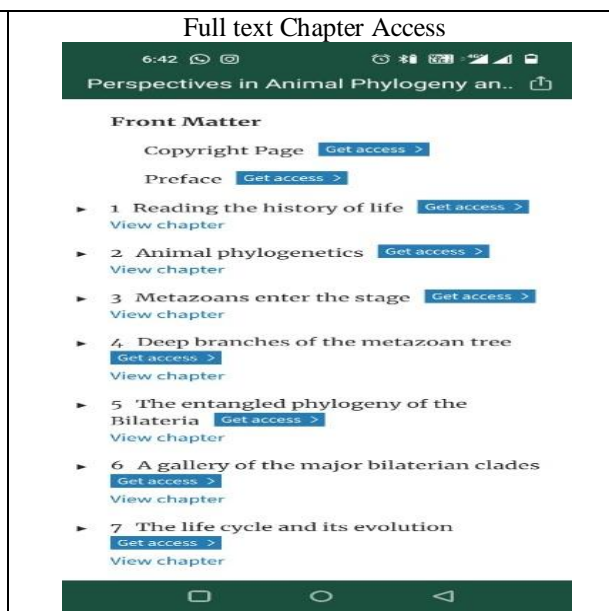


Fig. 18: Full text Chapter Access
